IAEVG, Tsukuba, Japan

September 18–21, 2015

“Restructuring Careers Over Unexpected Powerful Forces”

In today’s world, we encounter eminent danger to our careers by the unexpected powerful forces of nature, such as earthquakes. As Japan continues to recover from the damage of the 2011 Great East Japan Earthquake, conference organizers are ever-mindful of the impact this natural disaster has had on the economy and people’s individual careers. Therefore, this conference will address the restructuring of careers, the empowering of the discouraged, and the sharing of gratitude in recovery efforts related to this event and others like it around the world.

The IAEVG, the Asia Regional Association for Career Development (ARACD) and the Japanese Society for the Study of Career Education (JSSCE) are organising a joint international conference at the Convention Centre in Tsukuba, the largest comprehensive science technology site in the country, approximately 50 km from Tokyo.

Participants will be able to observe cutting-edge research activities, experience some Japanese cultural events, and attend social programmes.

Nine Thematic Fields:

1. Delivery system for lifelong career guidance to all citizens
2. Career counseling approaches to empower the discouraged and disenfranchised
3. Public policy for diversity
4. Education: Pathways that lead individuals to construct career and life
5. Call to action: Addressing the needs of NEET, social isolates, and youth unemployed youth
6. Community action: Collaboration among stakeholders in building partnership
7. Assessment, measurement, and evaluation: what we know works
8. Professional development: preparation and training for the career teachers and practitioners
9. Restructuring careers under promising practices

Three Formats of the session:

1. Paper sessions: Presentation of 30 min including discussion, grouped under the same domain of communication and theme
2. Poster sessions: Presentation and discussion with the audience
3. Symposium: Sessions of 90 or 180 min that examine a topic
